Three clean ups are required in order to receive the monies available to us.

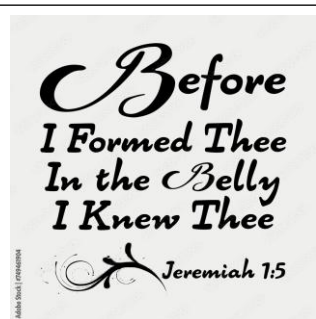
If you are willing to volunteer for this fundraiser activity, please see Margie. We are hoping to clean the parks on October 8, November 5 and again in the Spring of 2026.
