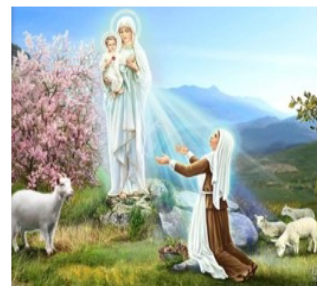

November 21, || World Youth Day Local Vigil || 7:00pm (Doors open 6:30pm) – 10:00pm || St. Boniface Cathedrale (180 De La Cathedrale Ave, Winnipeg) Join us for a special evening of prayer, music, and reflection as we gather with Archbishop Albert LeGatt and Archbishop Murray Chatlain for our Local World Youth Day Vigil Night — a time for young people and youth ministers to come together in friendship and faith. This night will be filled with praise and worship, Scripture and creative storytelling, and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. The vigil will include moments of reflection, multilingual prayer, and a special blessing as a young person. As a sign of unity and mission, participants will also receive and exchange friendship bracelets as a reminder that we are sent forth to be friends and witnesses to one another in the world.

On May 18, 1920, during the month traditionally dedicated to Mary the Mother of the Lord, a child was born in the town of Wodowice, 35 miles southwest of Krakow Poland. Karol was Baptized into Christ and His Church on June 20, 1920 by a Chaplain in the Polish Army, Fr. Franciszek Zak. Karol was the son of a Polish Army Lieutenant also named Karol, a tailor by trade. Karol's mother Emilia, was a schoolteacher. He had an older brother named Edmund and sister named Olga. His brother became a Doctor in the town of Bielsko. Sadly, his sister died before Karol was born. Young Karol lost his mother a month before his ninth birthday, to heart and kidney problems. His eldest brother Edmund, a doctor, died in 1932 of scarlet fever when he was only 12 years old, and his father died in 1941.

In 1987, Saint Pope John Paul II shared these thoughts with young people in Los Angeles, "I am often asked, especially by young people, why I became a priest. Maybe some of you would like to ask the same question. Let me try briefly to reply. I must begin by saying that it is impossible to explain entirely. For it remains a mystery, even to myself. How does one explain the ways of God? Yet, I know that, at a certain point in my life, I became convinced that Christ was saying to me what he had said to thousands before me: 'Come, follow me!'

"There was a clear sense that what I heard in my heart was no human voice, nor was it just an idea of my own. Christ was calling me to serve him as a priest. And you can probably tell that I am deeply grateful to God for my vocation to the priesthood. Nothing means more to me or gives me greater joy than to celebrate Mass each day and to serve God's people in the Church. That has been true ever since the day of my ordination as a priest. Nothing has ever changed this, not even becoming Pope.”
